It locates at the intersection of several social science disciplines including communication and media research, linguistics, discourse studies, political science, political sociology or political psychology. They may focus on various dimensions of political communication in general and of political language/discourse in particular.

Co-Editors Aurelien Mondon and Michelle Lazar take care of Submissions and Reviews; Co-Editor Samuel Bennett manages Publishing and Production; and Co-Editor Bernhard Forchtner coordinates the Special Issues. Their email addresses can be found in the Board list.

JLP welcomes review papers of any research monograph or edited volume which takes a critical and analytical approach to the study of language and politics, as broadly conceived above.
